
ORDERS AND **ARTICLES** GRANTED BY THE HIGH AND MIGHTIE LORDS THE STATES GENERAL OF THE VNITED PROVINCES,

Concerning the crecting of a VVest Indie Companie:

Together with the Priviledges and rights ginen wato the fame.

He States Generall of the vnited Provinces, vnto all thole that that fee thefe, greeting . We make knowne, that we confidering the good of thefe Lands, and the welfare of the inhabitants of them, to confilt principally in the nauigation and traffike which in all times out of these Countries with good fucceffe and bleffings in all kingdomes and countries have continued. And defiring that the faid inhabitants not onely maintaine and keepe their former nauigations and traffikes, but likewife as much as is poffible increase the fame, and principally according to the treaties, alliances, contracts and entercourfes concerning the traffike and naulgation with other Princes, Commonwealths and Nations in former times made, which we underftand in all points to be kept and observed. And we perceiving that without a common helpe, affiftance and meanes of a generall Companie, nothing can be undertaken in the places hereafter specified for to get profit and to maintaine and defend the fame, in regard of piracies, exortions and other like matters happeningfuch long nanigations. We have in regard of thefe and other weighte reafons and confiderations meuing vs vnto the fame as likewile ripe deliberations of our Counfels, and other pregnant and weightie occasions mouing vs in like maner found good, that the nauigation, traffike and commerce in the quarters of the West Indies and Africa , and other places named hereafter in times following, no more fhall be exercifed and vied then by common and writed power of Merchants and inhabitants of these Countries, and that to the fame purpofe fhall be crected a generall Companie, which we in regard of our fingular affection and loue to the common good, and to preferue the inhabitants of the fame in traffike and welfare, fhall maintaine and ftrengthen with help, fauour and affiftance, for as much

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as the prefent flate and condition of these countries in any maner of wayes can permit, providing for the lame a fit grant, with primiledges and liberties, here following ; via. That within the terme of foure and twentie yeares, none of the natives or inhabitants of thele Countries, other wife then onely by the authoritie of the vnited Companie of these voited Provinces, or from any other country shall nauigate or traffike vpon the coalts and lands of Africa, from Topica, Caners, vntill Cabo de bonna Esperanca, neither upon the countries of America or Weft India, beginning from the South end of Terra nona, through the Araight of Magellanme le Maire or other Araights or pallages thereabout, vntill the ftraight of Anian, as well vpon the North as South fea, neither vpon any llands either at the one or other fide, or betwixt them both fituated ; likewife neither yoon the Auftriall or Southlands lying betwixe both Meridians, touching at the East fide Cabo de bonna Elperanca, and at the Weft fide, the Eaft fide of Nona Gaines, inclusive. And if any man without leave of the faid Companie Ihall faile or traffike into any of these aforefaid limits granted vnto this Companie, the thips and goods shall be forfeited, having traffiked in any of the aforefaid parts, which immediatly every way shall be taken and feifed vpon by the Companie, and kept for the vie and benolit of the fame. And in cale fuch thips or goods thall be fold, or landed in other countries or ports, fhall the Merchant venturers and participants be answerable for the value of the fhips and goods, and be conuided for the fame, with this caution, that those that before this graunt of these or other countries are failed vnto any of these coafts, may fell their goods and teturne backe againe in thefe lands; or otherwile vntill their grant is expired (if they have gotten any before this time) continue, and not longer, obferuing that no body now at the beginning fhall fend any fhips or goods into the parts in this Patent comprehended, notwithflanding at the lame time perhaps the Companie be notfully concluded, promiding for the fame as is fit, and againt

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again ft them that wilfolly again to our good intention (hall feeke to wrong the generall good. We understand neuertheleffe that it fhall be free forevery one to fetch falt from Ponte del Re, but vpon conditions and inftructions by vs allowed or to be allowed, without otherwife in any maner to be tied vato this grant

That moreover the faid Companie is our name and by our suthoritie fhall have power, within the limits here before fet downe, to make contracts and alliances with the Princes and natives of the countries herein comprehended, as likewife to build forts and ftrong holds, to chufe gouernours, and men for warres, Officers of juffice, and : all other necellary vies for the confernation of good orders, policie and iuffice, as for the aduancement of trading and traffiking thall be required; as likewife to depole and put downe, and to fublitute other in their places, as they fhall finde convenient, Furthermore they fhail fearch plentifull and not whinhabited places to plant the fame, and do every thing that will be good for the fernice and profit of the Countrie, and which the increase of traffike will require, And these of the Companie shall from time to time communicate to vs, and deliver fuch contracts and alliances as they fhall make with the faid Princes and nations, . befides the fituations of the forts. places of defeace, and plantations by them taken in hand.

Observing that the Companie having chosen a Governour, and conceived infiructions for him, he thall be approved by vs, and receive his committion . And the faid Governour generall fhall as well as other Vice or Subflitute gouernors, Commanders and Officers, be (worse both vnto Vs and the Companie.

And in cafe the faid Companie in any of the places aboue mentioned happen by fained friendlhip to be deceiucd or ill vied, or that apy fummer of mony or merchandizes

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dizes trufted abroad without reflicution or paiment for the fame be detained, that they shall fee to repaire the damage, according to the caufe, and as for their abilitie shall be most requisite.

And becaufe for the plantation, fafetie and defence of this traffike, fome men of warre of neceffitie must be leuied, we will prouide for the faid Companie fuch Commanders, fouldiers and enginers as shall be requisite, though vpon condition they shall be paid by the faid Companie,

Which befides the oath made vnto vs and his Excellencie, fhall likewile be fworne to follow the directions and commandements of the Companie.

That the Prouofts of the Companie shall hade power and authoritie in these countries to take and apprehend such fouldiers and men of warre as shall be entred into the feruice of this Companie, and bring them to shipb ard, in whatfocuer cities, townes or iurifdictions they shall be found: vpon condition the faid Prouofts shall aforehand give notice of it wato the Officers and Magistrates of the place.

That we shall not take any ships, ordinance or munition from this Companie for the vse of these Countries, without the confert of the faid Companie.

Moreouer we have granted and yeelded vnto the faid Compane, and grant and yeeld by thefe prefents, that all their thips and goods thall patte freely, without paying any cuttome or tole due in thefe vnited Provinces : notwiththanding any forreiners may be partakers in the faid Companic, which in that regard thall enjoy like priviledges with the free inhabitants of thefe countries.

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That this Companie for the first eight yeares that ray nothing

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nothing for conuoy for their goods either comming in or to be fent into the Wef Indies and Africa, and other countries in the fame limitation comprehended : and is referued and concluded, that in cafe at the end of the first eight yeares the flate and condition of these countries cannot admit the faid priviledge of eight yeares to be continued for certaine yeares more, that the goods to be fent from' these parts, as likewise the wares of these aforesaid countries being to be transported in the conuoyes and licenses, fhall not be higher taxt or charged then they are now, except we are in warres sgaine, in which cafe all the aforefaid goods and wares shall not be taxed higher then they were immediatly before the truce made.

And becaufe this Companie may be well gouerned and to the molt profit and contentment of all the partakers, we haue ordered that the government of the fame fhall confift in fue Courts of Committees or Commillioners, as namely one at Amfterdam, which fhall have the administration of foure minth parts; one in Zealand, for two ninth parts; one about the Mass, for one ninth part; one in North Holland, for one ninth part ; and the fift in Vriefland, the citie and Land likewife for a ninth part, vpon conditions fet downe in the Register of our resolutions, as appeares by the A& concerning the fame by ve delivered. And the Prouinces deftitute of Courts, fhall be fornifhed with fo many Commiffioners, as they fhalt bring a hundred thoufand gilders vnto this Companie, and they fhall be difperied amongft the other Courts,

The Court of Amfterdam Inall confift of twentie Com. millionen; the Court of Zealand of twelue; the Courts aboat the Mars and North Holland, every one of fourteene; and the Court of Profiling, after and land, like wile of fourseene, velefie hereafter'it appeare the faid not to be enough, in which cale we will at our liking and aduice of the nineteens increase the number of the fame. 30.

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And by thefe is granted authoritie vnto the States of the aforeiand Provinces, either before their ordinarie Deputies, or the Magiffrate of the cities in their Provinces, to take fuch an order for the registring and fublicitions of the partakers and Commillioners, as they shall finde a greeable vnto the customes and lawes of their Provinces; provided alwayes that none thall be chosen to be a Commillioner in the Court at Amsterdam, valiss he put fix theuland gilders flocke of his owne in the faid Companie; but in the Court of Zealand, as likewife in the Courts about the Mass, the Court in North Holland and Vriefland, they shall not be chosen Commission they bring not vnto the Commanie foure thousand gilders a peece.

That the Commiffioners thall attend the fpace of fixe yeares, and at the end of the fame, one third part shall be remoued by bils to be drawne; and two yeares after, a like third part to be removed ; and likewife two yeares after, with the laft third part to be done; and fo from time to time to discharge the elder in office. And in place of the difmilt or decealed, or for any reasons put by, shall be nominated three perfons by the Commiffioners, as well that are in place, as that are remoued, as likewife by the chiefe participants and vndertakers, that in perfon and at their charges will come at the Court. And out of these three, the forefaid Prouinces, their Deputies or Magiffrates shal chuse new Commiffioners, and continually supply the places vacant : and fhall be accounted chiefe participants all these that as much flocke of their owne bring in, as the aforelaid Commiflioners.

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The accounts of the rigging and letting foorth of the fhips and other things concerning the fame, shall be made within the space of three moneths after the departure of the fame; and within a moneth after shall be sent copies of the fame vato vs and the severall Courts. And concerning

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the returnes, and the fale of the fame, the Courts (whenfoeuer we shall finde it convenient, or any of the Courts defire it) fhall be bound to give vs and one another notice of all their flate.

Every fix yeares fhall the reckonings be given vp of all voyages and returnes, profits and dammages of the Companie : viz, one of the traffike, and another of the warres, feperatly; which reckonings shall be done publikly, and after bils affixed, that every one being interelled, may come at the making vp of these accounts. And in case before the end of the feuenth yeare the fame be not done, the Commiffioners shall lofe their provisions, and shall be converted to the vie of the poore, and they neverthelelle be bound to make their reckonings as before, within fuch a time, and vpon fuch penalties as fhall be decreed by vs againft fuch delinquents and infringers. And this notwithstanding there shall be made distributions as many times as shall be proved and certified ten in the hundred to be gotten by traffike.

No man shall during the time of this grant, have power to draw his cappitall or flocke from the Companie; and likewife no new partakers in the meane time thall be accepted : but in cafe at the expiring of the foure and twentie yeares, it shall be thought convenient to continue the faid Companie, or to crect a new one, fhall be made a finall reckoning and effimation or prife by the nineteene, with our knowledge of every thing concerning this Companie, 28 likewife of the neceffary charges the Companie hath bin at: and then every one may chuie whether he will draw his mony out, or in the enfuing Companie keepe wholy or in part. And in fuch cafe the Companie thall be bound to take the remaining things at her charge, and content the reft of the partakers that shall be willing to seperate themfelues from the Companie, every one according to his proportion; and that at fuch dayes of paiment as the ninetcene with

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with our aduice shall find conuenient.

That whenfoeuer a generall meeting of the aforefaid Courts shall be appointed, there shall meete nineteene perfons, eight from the Court of Amsterdam, foure from Zealand, two from the Macs, two from the Northern parts of Holland, two from Friefland, and also the citie and land, provided that the ninetene perfons or as many more as we shall thinke fit by vs shall be appointed and cholen, for to give their best directions for the dispatching of the affairs of this Companie.

By which generall allembly of the faid Courts, all matters concerning this Companie shall be propounded and concluded, with caution that in regard of matters of warre our resolution shall be required.

At the faid generall meetings shall be refolued when any ships, and how many, and towards what cosses that be fent or the generall good of the Companie, having no Court power to do any thing without a generall resolution of the reft. And in cale any of these Courts might happen to be careletle and negligent in the accomplishing of these resolutions, we have given and give by these fame the faid generall meetings, authoritie and power to cause offenders and delinquents to make reparation for their faults, and requested shall lend thereunto our helping hand.

The faid generall meeting shall be kept the first fix yeares at Amsterdam, the next two enfuing yeares in Zealand, and io from time to time in the two aforefaid places.

The Commissioners by the Companie fent so the faid meetings or elsewhere, shall have for their diet and wages foure gilders every day, besides the mony for the boate, ship or wagons: provided that these that shall travell from the one to the other citie, to frequent and wish the Courts

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as Commillioners and Alifants, thall receive neither the one nor the other from the Companie.

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And if happened in the faid generall meetings any matters of great weight & moment to occurre, which concerning the Courts could not agree, and did finde difficultie if they fhould ouerrule one another, we have taken vpon vs the deciding of the fame, and what we fhall finde good fhall be followed.

Within the space of a moneth hence shall be given notice by bils affixed, to all inhabitants both of these and other countries, that at the expiration of the five next following moneths, beginning from the first of lune, may be admitted & received, and pay their capitall funs in three paiments, viz. a third part at the end of the five moneths aforesaid, and the other two third parts within the three next ensuing yeares, vnless afterwards it be found more convenient to take longer time, of which the pattakets thall be advertised by bils affixed.

The Ships returning from their journeys are to land at the lame places they departed : and if it do happen that any fhips by reason of winde & wether land in other parts, as those of Amsterdam or the North parts in Zealand, or in the Maes, or those of Zealand in Holland, or those of Vriefland with their affociates in any other parts, that neverthe-Icle every Court fhall have the overfight & administration of his fhips and goods, and fhall have power to fend the thips and goods to the places where their owne Courts are kept, or hire other thips or veffels to convey the goods to the places aforefaid, with this claufe and caution, that the Commiffioners thall prefent themfelues at the places where the fhips & goods shall be arrived, without vling any facors or deputies in their name. And in cafe it be not conbenient for them to trauell whto those places, they shall leaue the charge & administration vnto the Commillioners

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of the Court next to the landing of thip and goods.

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If any of the Courts aforefaid receiueth any wares, of which any of the other is vnprouided, the faid fhall be bound to prouide the other according to her abilitie, and the fame being fold, fend more. That like wife the Commiffioners of the Court before mentioned, flanding in need of any perfons for rigging of their flaps or otherwife, fhall the w the fame wato any other Court of Courts, without wfing any factors or agents to the fame purpole.

In cafe any Provinces shall appoint an Agent for to geceiue the monies from the Participants in their precind, and to put the same in their Court, and to procure paiment of the distributions, he shall be admitted in the said Court, for to be informed and influenced of the out dealings, distributions and incomings, provided he bring in o the Companie fittie thousand gilders slocke or aboue.

The Commiffioners shall have one in the hundred of all goods going out or comming in, as likewife of all prifes or taken goods; but of filuer and gold but a halfe in the hundred: of which provision the Court of Amflerdam shall receive foure ninth parts, the Court in Zealand two ninth parts, the Court about the Mass a ninth part, the Court of Vriefland ioyned with the citie and land a ninth part, the Court of North Holland likewife a ninth part,

Prouided alwayes that they shall receive but once provision for the ordenance and ships, but none at all of the ships, ordenance and other things wherewith we shall affist the faid Companic; neither of the monies they shall take vp for the vie of the Companie, neitherfor the goods they shall fell, neither shall they bring in any accounts for the attendance and charges of diet and trauell of those they may appoint or fend for the fetting forth of the ships, or buying of the goods thereunto required.

The keepers of the accounts and of the cashes likewile, shall have their wages paid out of the prouision of the Commissioners.

The Commiffiones shall not fell or deliver any flips or goods or wares vnto the Companie either wholy or partly belonging vnto them; neither shall they buy or procure to be bought for them any merchandizes or goods from the Companie, directly or indirectly for them shall the hold in any part of the bargaine. In case they faile therein, they shall torfeit their provision of oue yeare (which shall be given vnto the poore) and them shall be discharged of their places.

The Commillioners shall be bound to give notice by bils affixed, of the merchandizes and goods they newly have received, because every one may know it before they are fold.

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And if any of the Committioners happens to decay in his eftate, that he be not able to make good and give fariffaction for matters trufted who him in regard of his admimittration, which might caufe damage, their flocke in the Companie fhall be anfwerable for the fame, being as a pledge and fecuritie for their true administration. And lakewife if any of the participants for goods bought or otherwife, be indebted who the Companie, and decayes in his eftate, that he be not able to pay his debts, his flocke in the Companie fhall be anfwerable for the fame.

The Commiffioners of the aforefaid Courts thall anfwer for their keepers of cafh and accounts.

That all the wares of this Companie to be fold by weight, thall be fold and delivered by the weight of Amferdem opely; and leave thall be given to weigh the fame

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in the fhips or flore houses, without paying any taxes, impost or weigh mony, vpon condition neuertheless that the fame being fold, shall be delivered at the weigh-house, and pay impost and weigh-mony as many times as they shall be fold, as all other goods of like nature are vied to be.

That the Commissioners or their goods shall not be arrefled or troubled for to have rekoning of the administration of the Companie, neither for the wages due vato any having bin employed by the Companie; but pretending any such matter, they shall be bound to call them before the ordinary ludges.

Apy fhips coming home, the Generals or Commanders of the fleete, fhip or fhips, fhall be bound to come vnto vs within ten dayes after their arriuall, and make report vnto vs of the luccelle of their voyage, as well by writing as by word of mouth, as we fhall finde connenient.

And if it happens (which is not to be thought) that any fhould croffe the nauigation, trafficke or trading of the Companie, agsinft the vniuerfall lawes, contracts, agreements and entercourfes, it fhall be lawfull for the Companie to defend her felfe, and take their courfe according. to the inflructions given by vs.

Furthermore we have promifed and promife by thefe, that we will-maintaine and defend the Gompanie in her free nauigation and traffike, and affift the fame to the faid purpole, with the fumme of ten 'hundred thousand gilders to be paid within the space of fue yeares, and the first two hundred thousand gilders shall be furnished as soone as the participants have brought in their first palment of their stocke promifed : provided alwayes that for the first ten hundred thousand gilders we shall receive profit and dammage as the other participants shall do.

And is cafe It do happen the Companie fhall be firongly affaulted and inpaded in any of the atorefaid parts, we fhall affift her (thefe countries in any maner of ways being able to do it) with fixteene fhips of warre, the leaft being three bandred tunne, befides foure pinnaces, the leaft fhall be foure foore tunne, being of every thing necellary well furnifhed of ordenance both of braile and iron, and fit quantitie of munision, double hangings, failes, ropes, ankers, and other necellaries, as thall be ht for any great voyage; prouided that the faid afterwards fhall be manned, victualled and kept at the charge of the Companie, ypor condition the faid Company shall fet forth likewife fixteen thins and foure pinnaces furnished as ours, for to defend the Companie from her enemies, as likewife to affanlt them. And our faid thips of warre thall ioyne with the thips of the Companie, and thall go forth wnder one Admirall, to be cholen by vs with aduice of the forefaid Courts or gen nerall meetings, and that follow our directions and commandements, agreeable to the refolutions of the Company, to make warres against their enemies. But the ships of the Companie being loaden, fall not hazard themfelues without great necellitie, :.

And if it shall happen that the charges of the warres in our countries here do grow leffe, and increase in the parts aforefaid, we have promised and promise by these presents to give as much aide and affistance vnto the Companie as these countries shall be able to permit, and the state or condition of the Companie shall require.

Moreouer we have ordered, that if it happen in time of warres any prifes to be taken within the faid limits of the Companie, as well from their enemies as pirates, or by any ading and affifting this Companie, as likewife the goods that shall be feiled upon by vertue of our Proclamations, all neceffary charges, and the dammages of the Companie futtes.

inffered by the taking of prifes, belides theiright of his Excellencie in qualitie of Admirall, according to our refolution made the first of April, Anno 160s, and the tenth part belonging to the Officers, mariners and fouldiers that have made the prifes, being deducted, they fhall remaine at the di'polition of the Companie, which shall be bound to keepe reckonings alunder of the fame. And the profit or benefit of the faid prifes, fhall be employed or beftowed to the fetting forth of thips, and paying of the men of warre. as likewile to the miking of fortifications, the putting in garrilons, and other like matters of warre and defence both by water and land, without making any distributions, vnleffe it did appeare the faid profit and benefit to be fo great, that without weakning the defence of the Companie, and all charges of the warres being deducted, a good portion might be douided, feperated from the commerce. And the distribution shall be made in this manner : a tenth part shall be given for the general good of these countries, and the reft shall be deuided amongst the Participants of the Companie pro rate and according to their flocke.

Prouided alwayes that the goods and prifes by vertue of our Proclamations feifed vpon and brought in, shall be cenfured by the ludges of the Admiraltie where they are landed, and iudged whether they be lawfull prifes or not: And during the fuite the administration of the faid goods, after a due Inventorie made, shall remaine vnto the Companie, referuing the refidue for those that by the fentence of the Admiraltie might finde them felues aggricued. And the V endumaister or outcrier, and the other officers of the Admiraltie, shall not pretend any thing of the prifes benefited or fold by the Companie, they having had nothing to do with the fame.

The Commiffioners of this Companie shall be bound by eath, so be true and faithfull in their administration, to keepe good reckonings of their dealings, to procure the most

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most benche of the Companie, and so storide all beir and dammage as much as final be in their power; that they fhall not is used any of the groutes? Participants more this the leaft, either in the bringing in of their flockes, or the making of the diffributions : that of those that faall owe mony to the Companie, they find not tauour, the one more then the other : that they as long as they fhall be Commiffioners, fhall keeps fuch flocke in the Companie as is prefixed by this grant; as likewife that they fhall keeps and obferue every point and asticle here aboue mentioned, and procure to be held and kept according to their abilitie.

All which priviledges, liberies and exemptions, befides the affiltance afore intentioned in every point and article here aboue, we have granted vinto the Laid Companie after good aduice, and do grant by thefe, promife and give by thele promiling to procute that they thall enjoy the fame without any disquierneffe or hinderance. We order likewife that the faid shall be kept by all Magistrates, Officers and fubicets of these vnited Provinces, without doing any thing contrary voto the fame, either directly or indirectly, within or without these vnited Prouinces, vpon paines to be punished both in body and goods, as enemies of the com. mon good and infringers of our orders, Promiling belides to maintaine the Companie in all points aforefaid, by all treatics of peace, alliances, entercourles, with the neighbour Princes, kingdomes and countries, not fuffering any thing to be done contrary to the fame. Wherefore wee charge and command directly all Gouernours, Juffices, Officers, Magistrates and inhabitants of these vnited Prouinces, that they permit and fuffer the faid Company and Commiffioners to enjoy peaceably and without any diffurbance the effect of this grant, confent and priviledge, cealing by this all other matters ordered to the contrary, And because none might pretend ignorance of thele, we have commanded

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that the principal points of this Grane Thall be made knowne either by publication or affixing of bils, where is fhall be required, judging the fame to be for the good of this Counties the official state shorts to terms and bruch built to offic

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
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
