HARLES by the grace of Goo, King of England, Scotland, France, and Ireland,

Defender of the Faith, &c. To all to whom these presents shall come, greeting.

VVhereas the Region, or A3 Coun-

Countrey called New-foundland, hath beene acquired to the Dominion of Our Progenitors: which VVe hold, and Our people haue many yeeres reforted to those parts, where, and in the coasts adioyning they imployed themselues in Fishing, whereby a great number of Our people haue beene seton worke, and the Nauigation and Marriners of Our Realme hath been much increafed.

And Our Subjects reforting thither, one by the other, and the natives of those partswere order-

ly and gently intreated, vntill of late some of Our Subjects of the Realme of England, planting themfelues in that Countrey, and there residing and inhabiting, vpon conceit, that for wrongs or iniuries done there, either on the Shoare, or in the Sea adioyning, they cannot be here impeached, and the rather, for that We, or Our Progenitors, haue not hitherto giuen Lawes to the Inhabitants there, and by that example, Our Subiects reforting thither, iniure one another, and vse all manner of excesse to the great hinderance of the

the voyage, and common dammage of this Realme: For preuen. ting fuch inconveniencies hereafter, VVee doe hereby declare in what manner our people in Newfound-land and vpon the Sea adioyning, and the Bayes, Creekes, or fresh Rivers there, shall be guided and gouerned: Doe make and ordayne the Lawes following in the things after specified; Commanding that the same be obeyed and putin execution.

First, if any man on the land there shall kill another, or if any shall secretly or forceablie steale

the goods of any other to the walker of Forty hillings he shallbe forthe with apprehended & arrestedude tayned and brought Prisoner into England, and the crime committed by him shalbe made known course Earle Marshall of England for the time being : to whom the Delin I quent stiall bee delivered as Prifa. rien And the faid Earle Manhalb shal take Cognizance of the canfe: And if hee shall finde by the toll monie of two witnesses or more that the partie had there killed a man not being at that time first af faulted by the parcy flaine, or that the

or had stollen such goods; the Delinquent shall suffer paine of death, and all the company shall endeauor to apprehend such malesactor; would sham added and well

Secondly, That no Ballast,
Prestones, or any thing else hurtfull to the Harbourers be throwned out to the presidice of the said
Harbours, but that it be carried a shoare, and laid where it may not doe annoyance.

Thirdly, That no person whatsoeuer, either Fishermen or Inhabitants doe destroy, desace, or any way worke any spoyle or devris ment to any Stage, Cookeroome, Flakes, Spikes, Nayles, or any shing elfe, that belongeth to the Stages whatfoeuer, either at the end of the voyage when hee hath done, and is to depart the Countrey, or to any fuch Stages as hee shall fall withall at his comming into the Countrey, but that hee of they content themselves with such Stage or Stages onely, as shall bee needeful for them! And that for the repayring of fuch Stages, as he or they take, they shall fetch Tymber out of the woods, and not to do B₂ he

it with the rhining or tearing down ment to any Stage . 19 gar 2 ratho to Fourthly, That according to the ancient custome every Shippe or Fisher that first entreth a Harbourgain behalfe of the Shippe bee Admiral of the faid Harbour. scherin for the time beeing he shall referue onely to much Beach and Flakes, or both, as is needefull for the number of boares that hee shall wie, with an overplus only for one Boate more then hee neederhas a prisiledge for his first comming. And that every Ship comming after, content himfelfe with what

he

hee shall have necessary sieu for without keeping or detaining any more to the prejudice of others next comming and an advantage of others.

And that any that are possessed of feuerall places in feuerall Hara bours, with intent to keepe them all, before they cantefoline open which of them to choose, shall be bound to resolve and send advice to fuch after commers in those plan ces as expect his resolution, and that within fourty eight howres, if the weather so ferve, that the faid after commers may likewise thuse their places, and so none receive

prejudice by others delayes. Wifty That no person cut out, deface, or any way alter, or changethe markes of any Boats, or Traine-fats, whereby to defraud the right owners. And that no person convert to his owne vie the faid Boats on Traine fats fo belonging to others, without their conferes, nor remove, nor take them from the places where they be left by the owners, arexdept in cafe of necessity, and then to give notice thereof to the Admirall and others, whereby the right owners may know what Sixtly, is become of them.

Sixtly, that no person deed a minish, take away, purloyne, or steale any of the Fish, or Traine, or Salt which is put in Caske, Traynelats or Cookercome, or other house in any of the Harbours or Fishing places of the Countrey, or any other provision belonging to the fishing trade, which may breesquide shirt or Seucaelly, That no perfor fet fire in any of the woods of the Countrey, or worke any detrib ment or destruction to the lane, by Rynding of the Trees, either for the feeling of Shippes, holdes,

or for Roomes on Shoare, or for any other wies, Exceptifor the covening of the reefes for Cooker roomes to deelle their meate in, and shele Roomes not to extend about sixteene foor in length at bours or Fishing placesometh -nifighelydioThac no man caft Ancoraidrought elfe huttfull which may breede attooyance, or hinder the hateing of Seanes for batto in places accustomed Countrey, or worke arquered molroqr daft sed En, cyldrei Mne, robbe the Nieus of others out of any drift Boate or Drover for baite

bait by night, nor take away any bait out of their Filbing-boar by their Shippes fides, nor robbe or fleale any of their Nettes, or any

Tenthly, That no person dee fervp any Tanerne for felling of Wine, Beere, or from Waters, Cyder, or Tobacco, to entertaine the Filbermen, because it is tound that by fuch meanes they are debauched, neglecting their la bours, and poore ill-governed men, not onely foend most part of their fhares before they come home, upon which the life and mainmaintenance of their wife and children dependeth, but are likewife hurtfull in divers other wayes, as by neglecting and making themselves vnfit for their labour, by purloyning and stealing from their owners, and by making valawfull fhifts to fupply their disorders, &c. which disorders they frequently follow fince these occasions have presented theniclues. Lastly, That vpon the Sundayes the Company assemble in meet places, and have divine Service to bee said by some of the Masters

Masters of the Shippes, or some others, which prayers shall bee such as are in the Booke of Common Prayer.

And because that speedy pur nishment may be inflicted upon the offenders against those Lawes and Constitutions:
